CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

After almost two years of limited badminton activity due to the Covid-19 pandemic play coaching and competition finally started to happen again this season. There was a great deal to arrange and organise to enable tournaments, leagues and clubs to resume and the recovery has been slow but steady. There have been casualties sadly and we are aware of clubs that have not returned, leagues that have had to be reorganised and tournaments cancelled.

The sudden and unexpected passing of John Ellis was a huge shock to us all. He gave much to YBA in various voluntary roles over many years but especially to the juniors. Many of us were able to pay our respects at his funeral and to express our condolences to Barbara and his family. He will be missed greatly.

Russell Binns has looked after the county's finances for a good number of years now. He continued to do so even after he moved to Rugby but this is now his last year. He is standing down as he and his family are moving to Australia. We thank Russell for being such an excellent custodian and wish him and his family every happiness in their new adventure. Hopefully someone will come forward to take on this vital role soon.

Ashley Reed took on the role of Schools and Youth Chair supported by Nicola Read (who is County Secretary), and Helen Calverley. However, there is still a need for more committee volunteers as it's not ideal for current members to take on multiple roles.

Ian Hunter has been an excellent Masters Coordinator and organiser of the Yorkshire Masters Gold Tournament. The latter is a huge tournament with almost 300 players and in addition this year it also included Yorkshire being the host of the McCoig Competition - the Scotland v England International. Ian and his team of helpers have made it a great success and gained the praise of the National Masters Committee. Ian is standing down this year and the search for his successor continues.

When Ray Garnier retired from the Association, we were unable find a replacement for County Match Secretary so I have been covering this role and have looked after SCC teams and selection.

Thank you to Roger Cook who has continued as Affiliation Secretary, the County's voting representative at Badminton England meetings and one of our very few county tournament organisers. He did a great job looking after the County Restricted and the 17-21 English County Challenge again this year, as well as looking after 3 of the 4 Yorkshire League match weekends.

We are grateful to Lucy Kidd who became Yorkshire League Secretary and who organised the restarting of the leagues and introduced an online scoring system.

Janet and Dave Wobey (Tournament Secretary and Junior Match Secretary respectively) and Nicola Read have worked hard to look after the junior tournaments including scheduling and running them supported by some parents and volunteers. Janet is one of our few county officials who understand and use Tournament Software.

The number of volunteers for committee roles is contracting and I am uncertain for how much longer this will be able to be managed by those of us who remain in other roles. Badminton England has recently set up a National Youth Voice Forum and three of our young players have been recruited to it – Sian Philips, Grace Sachdeva and Angie Zhu. The Forum aims to raise the profile of young people in badminton and give them the chance to have their opinions and feedback listened to, shaping the future of our sport whilst developing their own skills and experience in the process.

On a positive note, players returned to the game enthusiastically and the Junior, Senior and Masters teams had a healthy squad of players available. As you will see from the reports there has been some considerable success. Highlights being our Senior first team gaining promotion back into the Premiership, Juniors winning the U17 ICT and our 17-21 team winning the ECC. One of our most successful seasons in a while! Fortunately, we have had a manager/captain for each of the 5 county SCC teams, the ECC squad, each of the 7 Masters age group teams and most of the junior age groups – special thanks go to Kathryn Metcalf for stepping in to run the U14 Team. Thank you to all of those players and coaches who have captained or managed a team this year as without you we wouldn't have a team.

Congratulations and good luck to Chloe Birch and Marcus Ellis who have been selected to represent England at the upcoming Commonwealth Games in Birmingham.

Babolat has continued to sponsor the county with kit and shuttles for which we are grateful. There have been supply issues which have delayed deliveries of some kit items for longer than usual.

Helen Clearly decided to stand down as Kit Manager. She has done a superb job of sourcing, printing and supplying the County kit for many years and will be sorely missed. The kit has passed to me and I have access to the printing equipment but supply issues and time have meant long delays on getting kit to players. Hopefully someone can be trained up for this role and the supplying of kit will improve next season.

The decision was taken to restart the Residential Summer School again this year. The dates are 14th -19th August 2022. It is again based at Bootham School and York RI. Ashley Reed and Nicola Read are the main organisers of the school. They will be supported by a team of County coaches and Pastoral staff. Bootham has given a scholarship place to Ivan a 16-year-old Ukrainian player staying with his mother and sister at Denis and Helen Cleary's home. YBA will be providing a bursary place for his sister to attend the school also.

Thank you to Holly Robson our BE Yorkshire Relationship Manager for producing excellent quarterly newsletters which we have circulated to all clubs and members. They are an excellent communication tool for informing the Yorkshire badminton community about current news, personalities and diary events, coaching courses, etc.

County business has gradually returned to normal, whatever normal is? Most meetings have been conducted via Zoom which is likely to be the case for the foreseeable future. It does save time and means a better attendance at Council and Executive meetings.

My thanks to Nicola Read our County Secretary who has committed a huge amount of time to county business and is a great support. My apologies if I have left something out of my comments here but hopefully it will have been recognised somewhere else in this annual report.



Financial Summary

As there has been no YBA AGM since 2019, the graph below shows the year end balances held across the various YBA accounts since 2018 and our current position.



YBA has proved to be a resilient organisation throughout the Covid-19 pandemic, and we have recovered well in financial terms following a small dip in total funds available.

As a recap, the 2019-20 season came to an abrupt halt in March '20 which meant that YBA was unable to complete activities that usually boosted year end finances, resulting in the final position of \sim £38k. The following season saw very limited activity at a county level. There were some junior training sessions, and a variety of refunds processed, resulting in the raise in overall funds to \sim £41k. Detailed accounts can be provided upon request.

Financial activity has been largely back to normal in the most recent season, with several key points to note:

- The total funds at this stage of the season are healthy, and all segments seniors, juniors and masters are running at breakeven or better. Additionally, the PayPal account balance is £1k.
- 2. Tournament income has been the largest in our history at nearly £30k. All tournaments have turned a positive return in terms of profit, albeit some of the smaller junior tournaments have only just achieved this. The Masters Gold continues to be the most successful.
- 3. Affiliation income continues to decrease.
- Several county activities run at an agreed loss due to the positive return we see elsewhere, for example, SCC, ICT, junior matches and training. We do this to ensure Yorkshire players benefit from our success in running other events.
- 5. Shuttle costs have been centralised. They are notoriously difficult to allocate given we usually hold and carry over stock. Details can be provided upon request as to where we have used shuttles, but they are primarily used for Yorkshire League, County Restricted, training and some matches, and Masters' Gold.
- 6. The Yorkshire Residential Summer School will run again this season, and we are currently benefiting from entry fees with limited expenses the final year end position will be lower than we are today (estimate ~£3-4k lower).

Match Secretary's Report

It has been a very busy return season with three weekends all happening after Christmas. Fortunately, many of our players were keen to get back to competition so we were able to field five teams again. However, as has always been the case, we struggled for ladies and there were quite a few promotions from lower teams to fill gaps.

SENIOR COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Championship League matches are played over three separate weekends over two days with total of nine matches. The Regional League (Division 1) is split into two sections (North & South) with eight teams per section playing their matches regionally including a play-off for promotion to the Championship. Divisions 2 - 4 have four sections, also with eight teams, and with promotion/relegation across each section. The 17- U21 English County Challenge is played over one weekend, late in the season, and is hosted by Yorkshire.

1st Team (Championship) FIRST (CHAMPIONS)

An amazingly successful season for our first team winning 8 of their 9 matches and topping the division with 74 points and regaining the county's place in the Premiership division. Some of our youngest players represented the team which bodes well for the future and it was great to see Jenny Wallwork back playing after a long break.

2nd Team (Championship) EIGHTH

Loss of players to the first team made it difficult in such a strong division. Excellent commitment from players and great management from Mark Pratt saw the team fight hard for eighth place just keeping out of the relegation zone.

3rd Team (Division 1 North) FOURTH

A challenging season for the team that kept losing players to higher teams and often playing with a minimum number. They were pulled through by the experience of long serving players and ended up with a very creditable mid table position.

4th Team (Division 2 North) SECOND

An outstanding first season for this team in this division despite a number of unexpected challenges and often losing players to higher teams. Losing team manager Ian Bucknell after the first weekend was a sad loss but all credit to player Mark Harrison who stepped in so well for the rest of the season. Promotion to Division1 North will be a massive step up but well deserved.

5th Team (Division 2 North) SIXTH

Lots of new players in this team making their county debuts. Some close losses but a strong finish resulted in an excellent sixth place just above the relegation zone.

Yorkshire 17-21 ECC Report 2022

The ECC team this year consisted mainly of players whose final junior county season was 2018-2019 (immediately before COVID). Many of these players, including myself, have had to painfully settle for 2nd and 3rd place trophies at dozens of county events in the past, often missing out by very fine margins. For this reason, the 17-21 ECC 2022 was a major emotional breakthrough for many of us; it felt a surreal experience to finally climb to the highest step of the podium.

The professionalism and chemistry of the team shone through from the get-go. Yorkshire opened with a pair of clinical wins, 5-1 against both Sussex and Hertfordshire. Established partnerships and new pairings alike seemed to be gelling and performing flawlessly. Carrying this momentum forward, the team defeated Leicester 6-0 in the final match of the day. These efficient victories later proved to be vital because Sunday's matches were doubtlessly more testing.

Due to sore muscles and even sorer minds (from an eventful night in York), Sunday morning brought with it a tense result. Yorkshire began with some noticeably shaky opening rubbers against Avon, but eventually the team was able to somewhat cut its losses and settle for a 3-3 draw. Nervously watching Avon and Devon battle out a nailbiting fixture, the team rested assured that the stakes – and indeed the standard of badminton – was rapidly increasing. In the end, Avon came out above Devon by a 4-2 margin.

And then, somehow, Yorkshire's time to play its final match had arrived. Everything was still at stake; hinging on the team's ability to handle nerves as well as fatigue, Yorkshire could still tangibly place at any of the three podium positions. Oliver Stapleton opened the singles with a convincing win, followed in suit by Emily Harper in the girls singles. As the matches progressed, the set scores grew tighter and tighter, with almost every rubber going to a deciding set. In the end, Yorkshire secured a 4-2 win against Devon.

This put us exactly neck-and-neck with Avon, in terms of wins, AND in terms of rubbers. Countback from the tournament referees was required. After a few minutes of tense whispers, the results were in: a brief drumroll and then, a voice emerged from the tournament desk. It said: "the number of sets are also... TIED!" High-pitched "oohs" and "ahhs" echoed around all the courts.

The voice from the desk continued, "so we must go down to points. And the winning county, by just SEVEN points is... YORKSHIRE!" Upon hearing this, our team's players, coaches, and parents alike erupted in an explosion of wonder, disbelief and joy! Sweaty high fives and hugs were exchanged unsparingly, photos were taken, and just like that: history was made... what a moment to be alive and part of Yorkshire badminton!

As the captain, manager, and coach of the team, I felt very proud, not just of everyone's unyielding efforts on court, but also of the professionalism and camaraderie with which we approached the event overall. I think everyone involved would agree that it was an extremely encouraging experience for Yorkshire, particularly so soon after the heart-breaking death of John Ellis. It is an event which - without a shadow of a doubt - I, my teammates, and everyone involved will remember for a long, long time.

All the players knew we had a job to do and in the regular season we had by far the toughest draw out of all the top teams. They more than excelled proving a lot of people what they were made of! Our results are as follows:

- v Leics- 15-5 WIN!
- v Warwicks- 14-6 WIN!
- v Lancs- 18-2 WIN!
- v Notts- 17-3 WIN!
- v Lincs- 20-0 WIN!
- v Cheshire- 17-3 WIN!

We finished 4th overall in the league having won every match, even against the toughest teams, convincingly. If you look at the teams that finished in 1st-3rd they had a much easier set of fixtures than us, hence our 4th place finish on points.

In the finals we had high hopes, but came away with a lot to learn. The way the finals are structured is frustrating, as if you lose your first match, even if you then win every other

match, you cannot place higher than 5th. This was our story. Our first match was a very disappointing loss v Warwicks, whom we had beaten in the regular season quite emphatically. I think this may have made us complacent and Warwicks took their opportunity to win 7-13.

We then had 2 more wins v Yorks 2 and Leics to finish 5th overall. Although I know we were all disappointed, the guts and determination the players showed to get back up and win the next 2 matches despite this was fantastic. They showed real character and I am very proud of them, and will miss those that are moving up.

<u>RIO</u>

Unfortunately, due to a variety of reasons there was no RIO this season. We can't wait to have it back next season and bring the title back to Yorkshire where it belongs!

<u>ICT</u>

First of all, wow, what an experience!!

Going into ICT we had high hopes and were seeded 1, however we were determined to not let this enter our heads and knew everyone was even more determined to beat us than usual!

John Ellis loved ICT from the minute Andy first played in it. He was there every year volunteering for BE, and I know he was just as determined as I still am to bring success back to Yorkshire where it belongs. He was extremely excited for this year's tournament and we had several conversations in the lead up to it about how to approach this year.

Masters Badminton Report 2021-22

Masters Competitions

Yorkshire entered a team in each age group from over 40s to over 70s of the Masters county competition in 2021-22.

Five of our teams topped their northern groups and reached the finals weekend. The 40s finished runners up to Staffs on games countback, having drawn 6-6 in rubbers. The 55s finished runners up to Essex.

The 70s finished third, with the 45s and 60s finishing fourth.

The 65s lost out in qualification to a Lancs side which went on to win the competition. The 50s struggled to find enough ladies doubles players and finished bottom of their group.

The County Challenge was supposed to take place in early Jan 2022 but was cancelled at a week's' notice. Groups have been declared for the 2023 competition already, with the over 45s, over 50s and over 65s relegated in Jan 2020 to group 1a. The remaining 4 age group teams remain in the Premiership division.

Yorkshire Gold.

The event was held from 4th to 6th March and was preceded by the McCoig international match between Scotland and England. 271 players entered the Gold event which included a number of Scottish players who had travelled down for the McCoig trophy match. A profit of around £5000 was made on the event.

Although at this stage the county has no Masters' coordinator, Jen Greensmith has offered to take on many of the duties involved as coordinator.

Affiliation Report

As a result of Covid19, there have been dramatic upheavals amongst clubs and organisations in the County, since the last Annual Report in 2019.

Keeping tabs on affiliation numbers was made almost impossible as a consequence of organisations having the choice of being allowed to defer their membership fees for the 2020/21 Season.

On the Badminton England Go Membership system, as of the end of May 2022, there are a total of 46 organisations listed.

This is made up from 39 Clubs, 1 Junior Club, 2 Performance Centres,

3 Social Sections and 1 Association.

This compares to 120 organisations that were listed in 2019.

Tykes has been disbanded, as the need for its existence is no longer required.

The total number of members affiliated in the County is 1,536. This includes all junior members.

The number of Coaches on the Coaching Register is 62.

Badminton England Report 2021-22

The last 12 months have mainly been focused on recovery from the COVID pandemic and helping badminton clubs and coaches across Yorkshire to rebuild and restart their sessions.

I would personally like to thank the Yorkshire Badminton Association committee for their continued support as well as all the volunteers and coaches across the county who work tirelessly within our sport to deliver, organise and oversee activity.

I would also like to offer my congratulations to the Yorkshire Under 18 team, who finished in first place at the 2022 ICT, and the team who claimed the trophy at the 17-21 English County Championships – two excellent results for Yorkshire following a difficult two-year period!

Club Support

- The majority of work with the clubs in the last year has been to support them with returning to play (providing guidance on when they were allowed to return, explaining COVID restrictions, helping to build club members back up to pre-COVID numbers & helping to locate new facilities for clubs who were unable to get back into their existing venues).
- Restart funding was allocated to one club in Yorkshire (Otley Badminton Club) to help with restart costs. The club received £300 to help with the costs of facility hire in the short term whilst they rebuilt their player base.
- Clubs have regularly been sent information on external funding streams which may be useful (e.g. Sport England Platinum Jubilee Fund & Arnold Clark Community Fund) with support offered form myself for bid writing and reading over bids prior to them being submitted.
- A new junior club has been established in York (York Junior Badminton Club), with weekly coaching sessions at York Leisure Centre, delivered by Level 2 coach, Daniel Woolfson.
- Five clubs & one No Strings session in Yorkshire were involved in delivering activity during Badminton England's 'The Big Hit' week in September 2021 (Harrogate Racquets Club, Beverley Badminton Club, Benton Park Badminton Club, York Junior Badminton Club, Otley Badminton Club & Emma Smethurst's No Strings session in Halifax).

School Delivery & Young People

- Coaches across the county have managed to get back into delivering in schools but school delivery has been less than previous years (which is to be expected) as schools were still cautious about allowing external coaches to come in and deliver when they started back in September 2021.
- The key coaches who have been delivering in schools are Richard Morris, James Farmer & Martin Drabble (Sheffield) and Paul Pratt (Hull) who have re-established the strong links they had built with schools prior to the pandemic.
- I have had discussions with the relevant Rackets Cubed Area Managers (Vicky Evans & Jules Silvera) to discuss possible sites in Yorkshire for Rackets Cubed badminton delivery for 2022/23. Identified sites are Middlesbrough, Hull, Leeds, Sheffield & Huddersfield/Halifax. Contact details for local coaches have been passed on to the Area Managers and the aim of the programme is to introduce primary school badminton delivery in areas of deprivation (where it will be combined

with STEM school subjects then provide a meal) and have a good junior club link to transition new players into.

 The Badminton England Young Leader Academy was delivered again for 2021/22 with four young leaders from Yorkshire taking part in the programme and actively volunteering within their clubs. The young leaders are: Angie Zhu (Thornaby Pavilion Badminton Club), Matilda Marshall (Hull Junior Badminton Club), Leon Higgins-Pemberton (Keighley Kobras Junior Badminton Club) & Evie Burnett (East Riding Badminton Club).

<u>Coaching</u>

- Active coaches across the county have regular email contact from myself as they are included on my email distribution list and, over the last 12 months, I have had direct contact with 24 coaches who are actively delivering across the county.
- The Badminton England Disability Coach Mentoring programme was launched in 2021 and there are two aspiring coaches from Yorkshire on the programme, Isaak Dalglish & Denise Cooper. Isaak has completed his Foundation Award (Level 1) and is working alongside Richard Morris & James Farmer to gain coaching experience then will be supported to achieve his Level 2 coaching qualification within the next year & Denise is looking to book onto an upcoming Foundation Award this year then she will be paired with a suitable Level 2 coach mentor.
- During 2021/22, four Coach Education courses were delivered across Yorkshire (2x Foundation Awards in Harrogate & Sheffield and 2x Level 2 courses in Harrogate & Pontefract).
- In 2022/23, five Coach Education courses are planned (3x Foundation Awards in Hull, Pontefract & Sheffield and 2x Level 2 courses in Sheffield & Pontefract).

No Strings Badminton

- Three new No Strings Badminton sessions (pay & play for casual players) have been set up in the last year. The first No Strings session is running in Keighley (delivered by Level 2 coach, Tim Shipman) which was awarded a grant of £388 from Badminton England to kickstart it, the second is running in Halifax (delivered by Level 2 coach, Emma Smethurst) which received a bundle of rackets & shuttles to help start up the sessions and the third is running at the University of Huddersfield with a few students trained as No Strings Badminton Co-ordinators to deliver the sessions.
- Discussions are ongoing with Zainal Muhammad (Level 2 coach) and Kirklees Active Leisure in Huddersfield to restart another No Strings session which was popular prior to the pandemic but never restarted when restrictions were lifted.
- The Badminton England Adult Programmes team carried out an audit of all No Strings Badminton sessions across the country a few months ago and data shows that there are currently 20 No Strings sessions which are running across Yorkshire (1 in Keighley, 7 in Sheffield, 1 in York, 1 in Scarborough, 4 in Pontefract, 2 in Leeds, 2 in Halifax & 2 in Huddersfield).
- I will be using this information to identify gaps where there is not currently any No Strings provision and looking to set up new sessions in these areas in 2022/23.

Para Badminton & Inclusion

• The GB Para Badminton set up in Sheffield is strong with Richard Morris as the Head Coach, James Farmer & Mike Reid as assistant coaches. The coaches

deliver a lot of the badminton activity in and around Sheffield so are well situated to identify new talent.

- A Para Badminton Festival was delivered in Sheffield in September 2021 as part of 'The Big Hit' week which saw 12 new players with disabilities engaged in badminton.
- The Badminton England Inclusion Champions programme launched in 2021 and the aim of this programme is to create role models to champion, promote and advocate inclusion within their local badminton community. There are three Inclusion Champions in Yorkshire (Helen Calverley, Faisal Motashar & Faz Khan).

2022 Badminton England National Volunteer & Coach Awards

- The 2022 National Volunteer & Coach Awards are presented annually and used to recognise the phenomenal work of the volunteer and coach workforce within the badminton community. 2022 saw a strong set of nominations for all the awards with a very worthy volunteer and an excellent grassroots coach from Yorkshire being announced as the runners up.
- Sheila Boyes (Thornaby) Grassroots Coach Award Runner Up Sheila has spent a great deal of her free time promoting badminton in the local area, especially for school age children. She coaches in local schools to provide children with the all-important first experience of badminton, as well as weekly after school clubs for those who want to play more. She runs Thornaby Junior Badminton Club, providing coaching for children of different ages and abilities. By working with the council, she also organises competitions between several local schools and inspires young people, not only to enjoy playing badminton, but also to challenge themselves, through taking part in tournaments or to become young leaders. A huge number of young players (and their families) have benefited from Sheila's continuous and tireless work over the years.
- Margaret Sinclair (York) YONEX Volunteer of the Year Runner Up Since the end of the COVID pandemic restrictions, Margaret has been the main person who has ensured that the York Railway Institute has been made available for badminton. She organises the weekly duty rota for volunteers as well as regular court and facilities cleaning, ordering of consumables for the venue, client liaison and financial controls. Margaret is regularly at the venue at 8am opening up and mopping the courts for weekend tournaments and is there again at close of play doing the same. She often provides refreshments at tournaments and can often be seen weeding outside the venue! She also collects used shuttles at the end of tournaments for the local junior club, enabling 20-30 children to play with feather shuttles, and keeping the courts tidy. She has supported the junior Club by making finances available to support ongoing training, courses and junior tournament prizes, ensuring the continuation of grassroots badminton as a fun, social sport and great way of keeping fit.

Margaret is also the Treasurer of the York RI Mon-Wed Badminton Club where she negotiates the hire of courts to keep the club running financially and also completed the Badminton England affiliations for the club and its members

Yorkshire Badminton Newsletters

• To date, seven Yorkshire Badminton newsletters have been produced and sent out to contacts across the county.
